Our Curriculum

At Peter Rabbit Nursery we have written our own curriculum and progression map looking closely at where are children are currently working and what their individual next steps should be. Our curriculum and progression map are based on the Development Matters document and the Montessori principles.

We will have a huge focus on reading this year and will focus on a new text every week or two. We hope to ensure children develop a love of reading and see reading as a pleasurable experience. We are also aiming to boost vocabulary by introducing the children to more adventurous words and using them in our everyday play. This week we talked about the words 'cautious', 'courageous' and 'considerate.'

Children are never too young to start their journey with books, and the benefits of reading are enormous.

Ideas to encourage reading at home ...

All the children at Nursery love snuggling up in the book corner with a good book and story time is one of the most popular times of the day (after lunch obviously!)

Here are some simple tips that can help encourage children to enjoy reading for pleasure:

- Read to your child for at least 30 minutes a day. This could be in the bath, cuddled up on the sofa or in bed.
- Sing songs and recite poems that have repetitive rhythms. Repetition makes it easier for your child to pick up on the patterns in the sounds you make.
- Model good reading yourself. Children need to see that reading is something everyone can enjoy. Good excuse to put your feet up for a bit!
- Visit your local library regularly.
- Follow your child's lead. Reading should be pleasurable, if they are not interested right now then try again in a couple of hours.
- Have a selection of books available around the house. Rotating books so different books are on display can keep it exciting for children.

The Nursery Building

As many of you may be aware our hall will now be used outside of nursery hours for other community events. This will not have any impact on the children but does mean that the hall will have to be cleared away once the children have left. Therefore we will no longer be able to leave any bags on pegs. If your child is fully toilet trained then you do not need to bring a bag in at all, we have plenty of spare clothes encase of accidents. Of course if they would like to bring one then they are more than welcome.

Reminders:

Please ensure all items (especially coats and water bottles) are clearly labelled.

Water bottles should only contain water. Please no juice or squash. Children have the choice of milk and water at snack time.

Lunch Boxes

Please can we remind all parents that we are a <u>nut free</u> nursery, this includes pesto. We were also struggling with chocolate products last year as many of the items children where bringing in contained hazelnuts, we therefore now have a blanket ban on any chocolate items.

Also a reminder that any small, round items must be cut lengthways and preferably in quarters. These include items such as grapes, blueberries, cherry tomatoes and strawberries.
